


Puddings, Peaks & Perfect Treats

Monday 13 August

Departing Oxted we head to the Coventry Transport Museum where we shall be free to explore and find lunch before continuing on to our hotel, where we shall be greeted with tea/coffee and biscuits.

Tuesday 14 August

This morning we head to the picturesque old market town of Bakewell set in an enviable location on the



banks of the Wye in the heart of the Peak District National Park. Whilst here, we visit the famous Bakewell Pudding Shop, where we shall watch the Pudding Maker's art in action and get the opportunity to make an original Bakewell Pudding yourself to take away with you. Due to the size of the pudding shop, we shall be split into smaller groups, with time for included tea or coffee in their restaurant and to explore the town. Early afternoon, having collected our Bakewell Tarts, we shall take a scenic ride around the Peak District National Park, renowned for its beautiful scenery and quaint towns that have been an inspiration to authors and artists alike.

Wednesday 15 August

Today we enjoy a wonderful visit to Renishaw Hall and Gardens, home to the Sitwell family for nearly 400 years. We will be personally greeted upon arrival, and served complementary tea or coffee. This will be followed by an exclusive & intimate guided tour of the Manor House lasting around an hour, after which a light lunch will be provided comprising of freshly poached salmon or gammon served with salad and new potatoes. After lunch, there will be free time to explore the surrounding 300 acres of gardens and parkland, or visit the museum and exhibition gallery at leisure. Our VIP experience will then be completed with an afternoon cream tea of scones with jam, cucumber sandwiches and tea & coffee.

Thursday 16 August

After breakfast we drive to the former spa town of Matlock Bath set in picturesque scenery among the limestone hills. Here we shall be free to explore and find lunch. Among the many attractions to enjoy are the Mining Museum, the aquarium and the Life in a Lens Museum, plus, of course, the cable car to the Heights of Abraham, to see the spectacular views. This afternoon we make the short journey to Wirksworth to board an Ecclesbourne Valley Railway heritage diesel train for the 9 mile journey to Duffield through one of Derbyshire's most lovely and unspoilt valleys. Named after the River Ecclesbourne, the track follows the river from its source to its confluence with the River Derwent at Duffield.

Friday 17 August

Departing the hotel after breakfast we make our way to Baddesley Clinton a romantic medieval moated manor house with hidden secrets! Discover Baddesley's fascinating late-medieval and Tudor history, from hiding persecuted Catholics in its priest's holes to the history of the Ferrers family who lived at Baddesley for more than 500 years. The peaceful gardens include fish pools, walled garden and a lakeside walk, perfect for a tranquil stroll. Continuing our homeward journey we arrive back late afternoon.
